3. Hazards Identification

<u>Primary Routes(s) Of Entry</u> - Ingestion (possible, but considered unlikely), eye contact, skin contact, inhalation. <u>Eye Hazards</u> - Can cause irritation after contact with the eyes. Do not apply this product to the area between the brow and the lower lashes.

<u>Skin Hazards</u> - Will cause a non-irritating brown discoloration of skin on contact. May cause allergic reactions in some individuals sensitive to self tanning lotions or cosmetics.

4. First Aid Measures
