#### SECTION IV HEALTH INFORMATION

EYE CONTACT: This product may cause slight eye irritation. Corneal injury is unlikely.

AGGRAVATED MEDICAL CONDITIONS: Pre-existing skin, eye and respiratory disorders may be aggravated by exposure to this product.

## SECTION V EMERGENCY AND FIRST AID

SPILL OR LEAK PROCEDURES: LARGE SPILLS>> Evacuate the hazard area of unprotected personnel. Wear appropriate respirator and protective

clothing. Shut off source of leak only if safe to do so. Dike and contain. If vapor cloud forms, water fog may be used to suppress; contain run-off. Remove

with vacuum trucks or pump to storage/salvage vessels. Soak up residue with an absorbent such as clay, sand or other suitable material; place in nonleaking

containers for proper disposal. Flush area with water to remove trace residue; dispose of flush solutions as above. SMALL SPILLS>> Take up

with an absorbent material and place in non-leaking containers; seal tightly for proper disposal.

WASTE DISPOSAL: Observe all Federal, State and local regulations regarding proper disposal.
