4. EMERGENCY AND FIRST AID PROCEDURES

8. EMPLOYEE PROTECTION RECOMMENDATIONS

GENERAL PROTECTIVE MEASURES:

Do not breathe dust. A void contact with eyes and skin. Immediately remove all contaminated clothing.

EYE PROTECTIONEmployees should wear protective eye-goggles with side protection shield.

SKIN PROTECTIONEmployees should avoid skin contact by wearing protective clothing. Long sleeve

shirts, pants, gloves e.g. of PVC or nitrile rubber, and boots are recommended. Additional protections such as impervious suits are recommended when the potential for dermal contact is significant.
